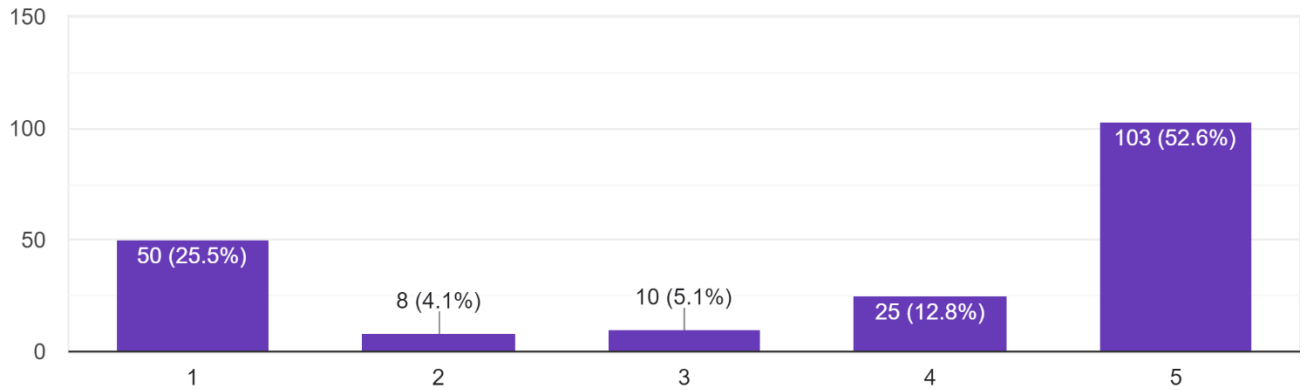

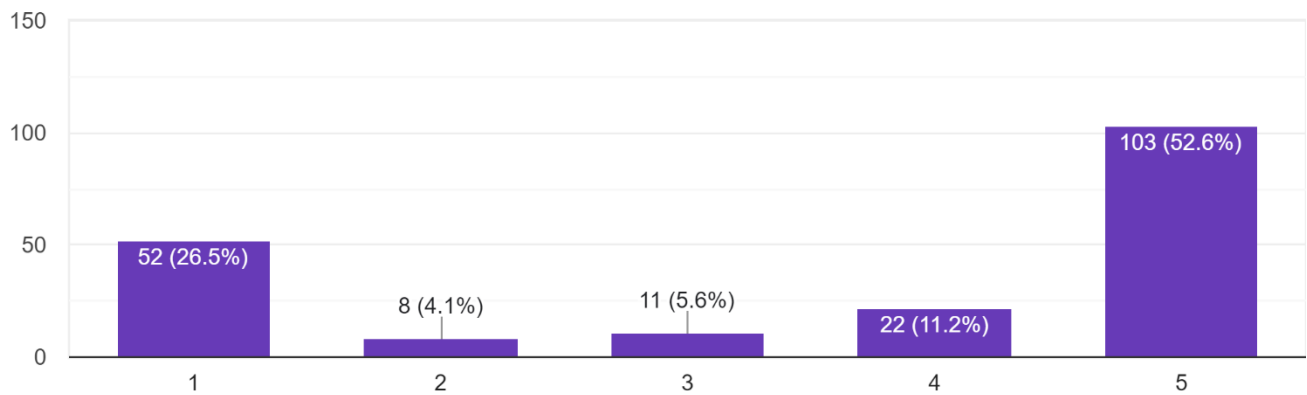
How worried are you about climate change? (1 = not worried; 5 = very worried)

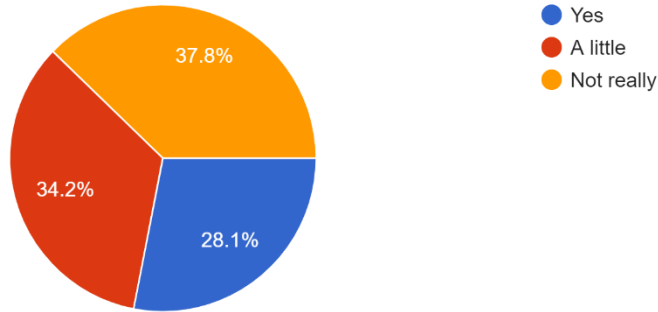
How important is it to you that the City do something about climate change? (1 = not important; 5 = very important)

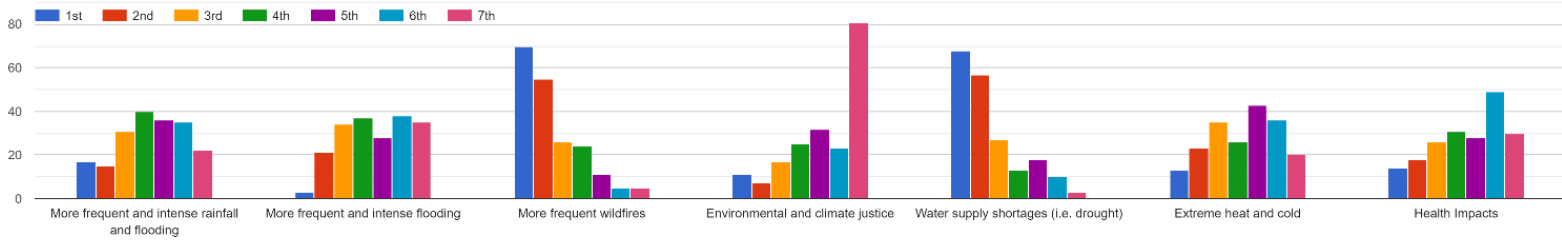


Are you aware of what the City is doing about climate change / climate adaptation?

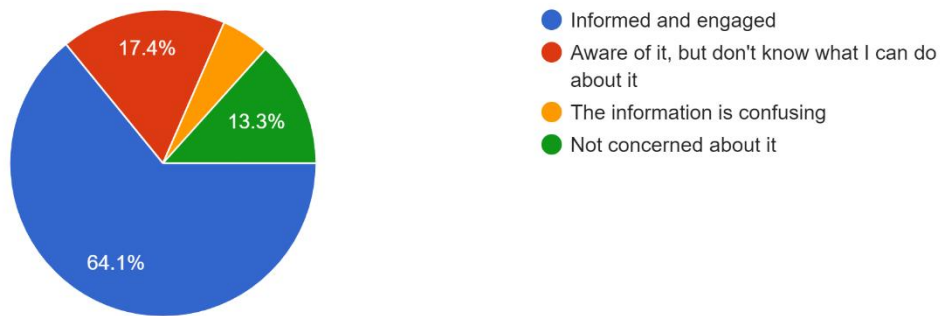


Which climate risks are you the most worried about? (Please rank from 1 -7, 1 being most worried and 7 being least worried)



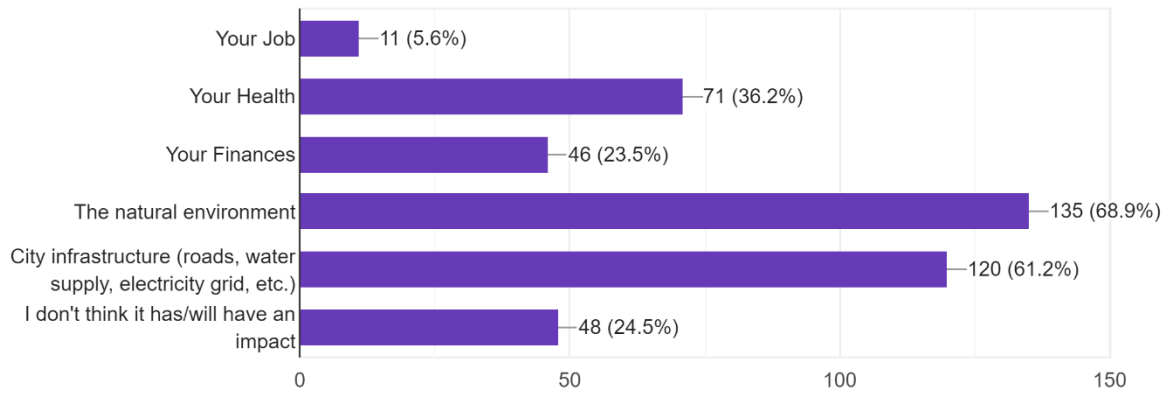
How do you feel about climate change?

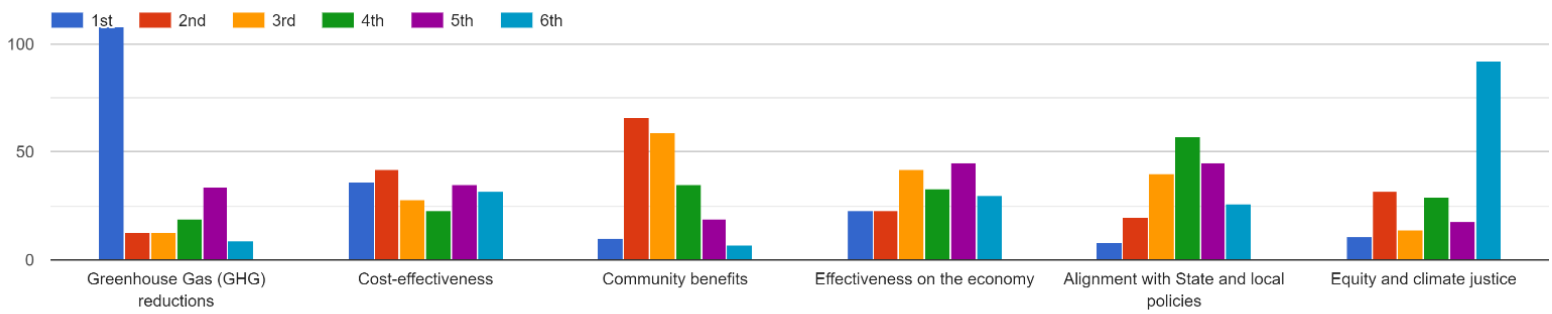


Do you think climate change has already had a negative impact on? (Choose up to three)

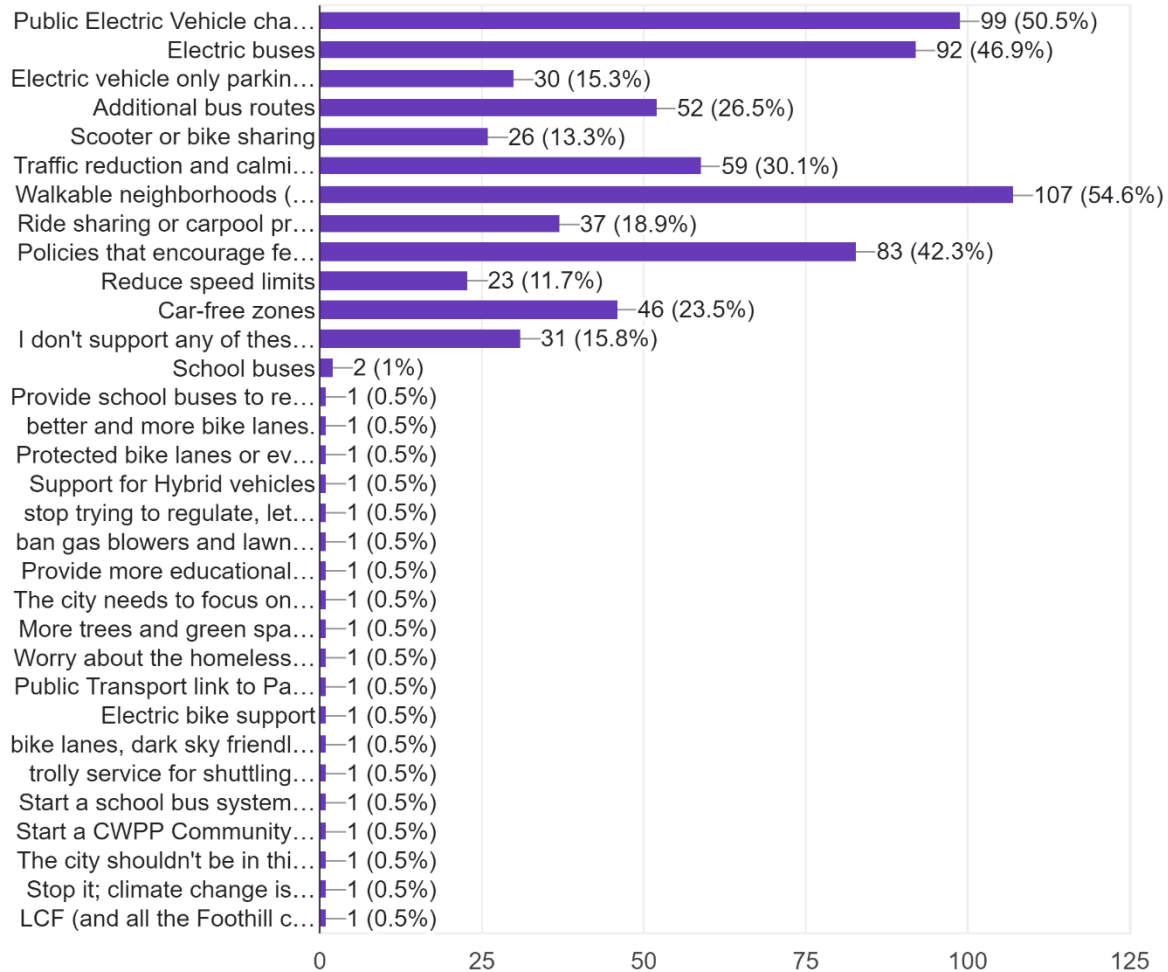

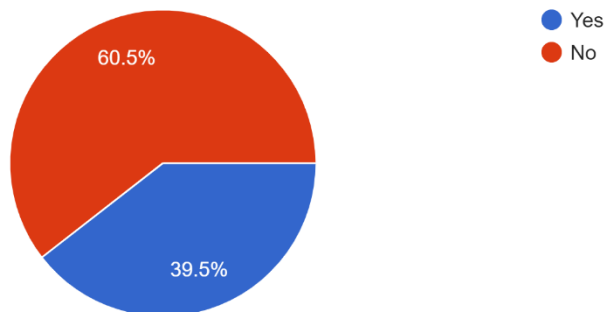

Ban gas blowers and lawnmowers

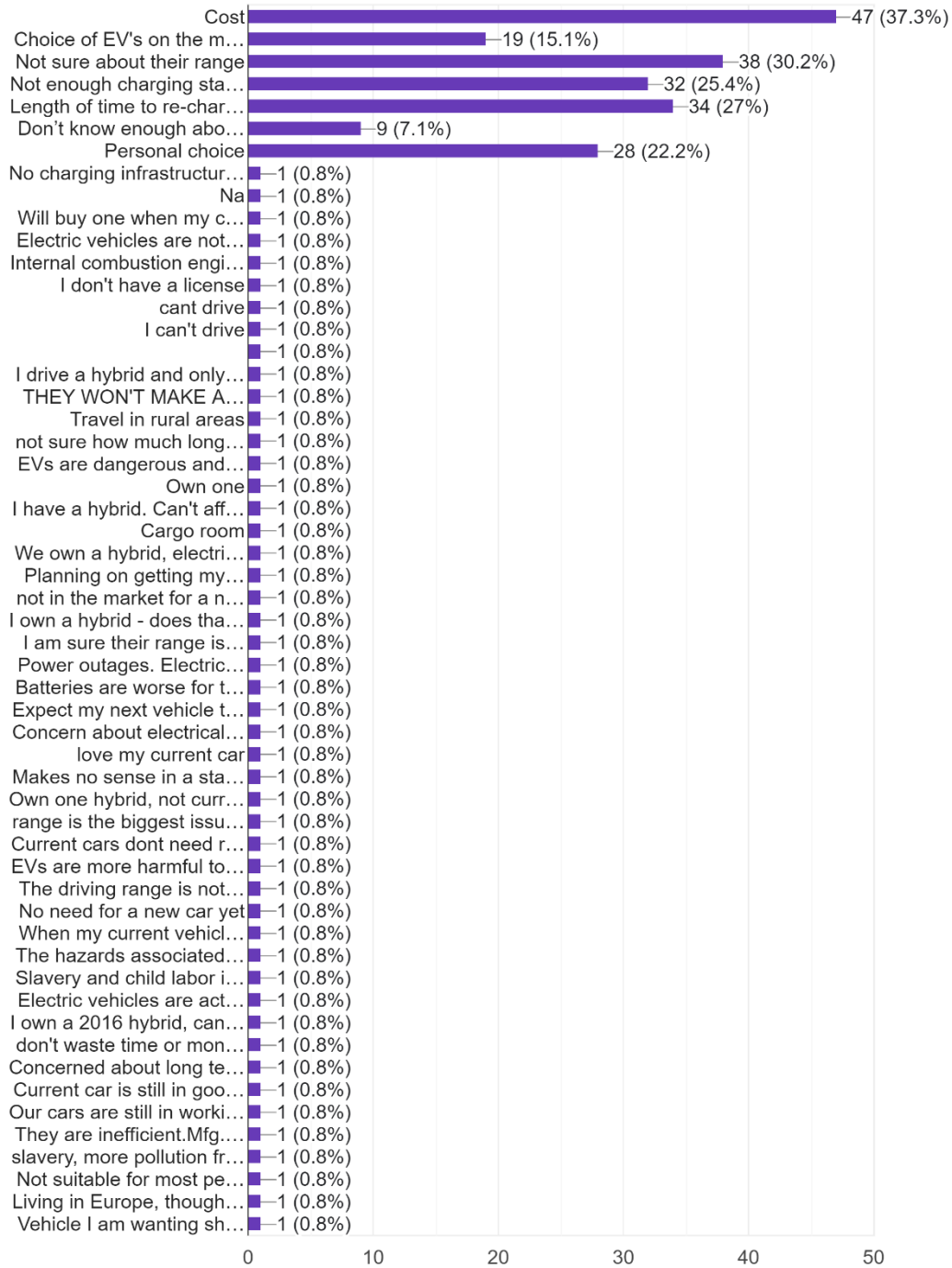
Do you own an electric vehicle?

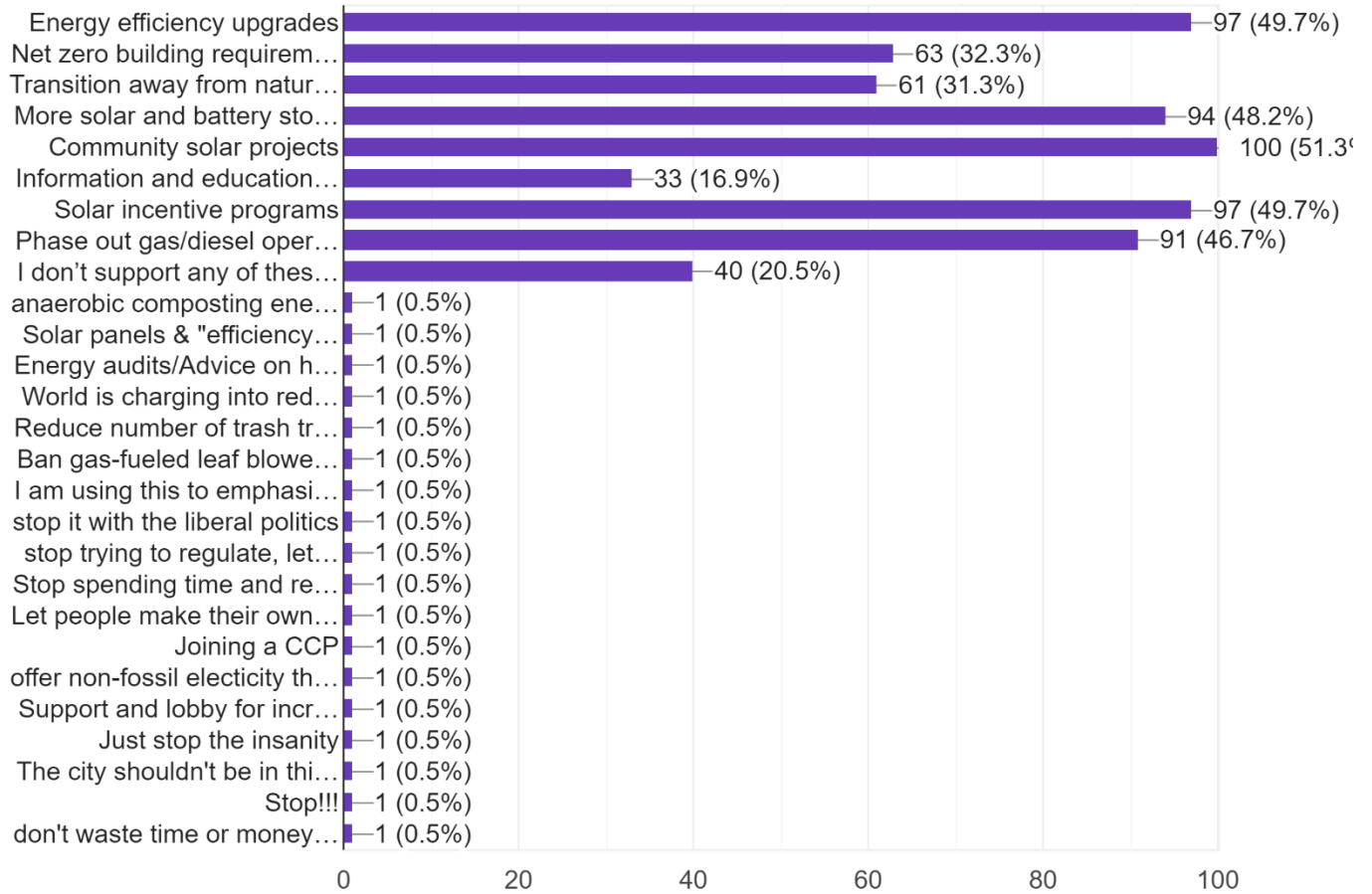

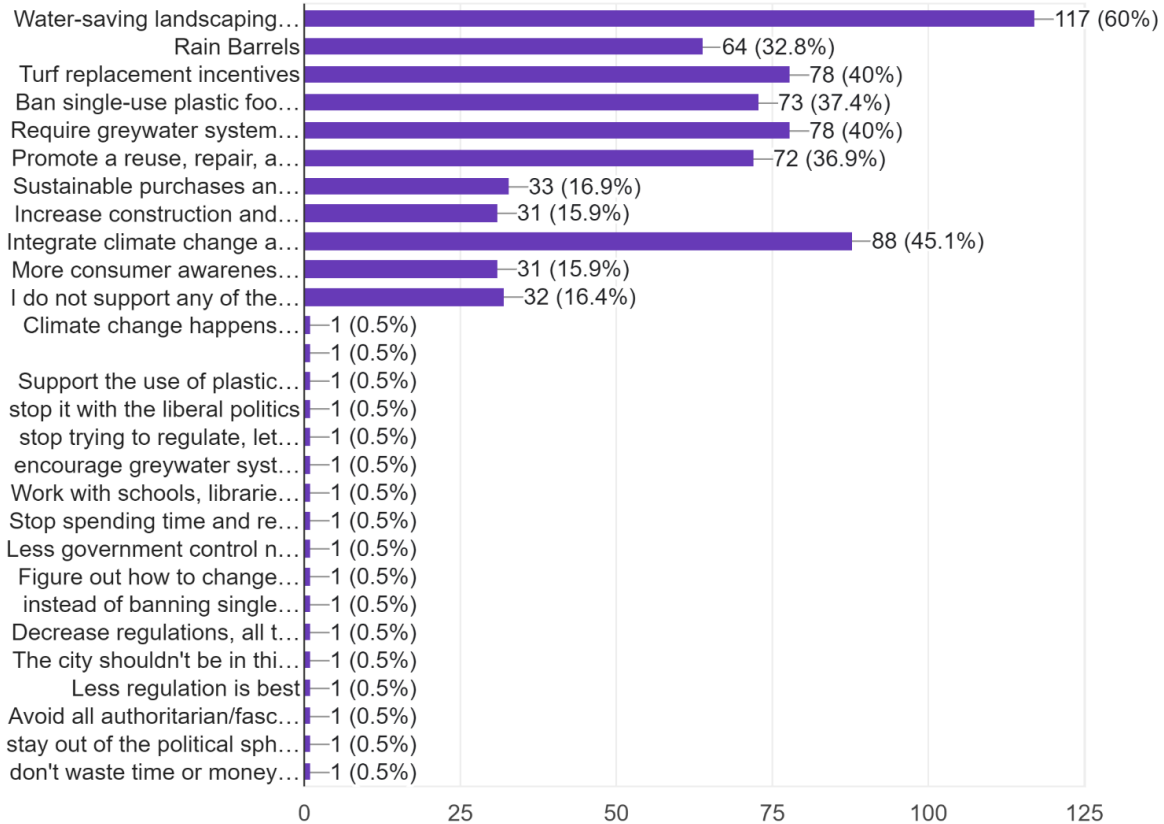

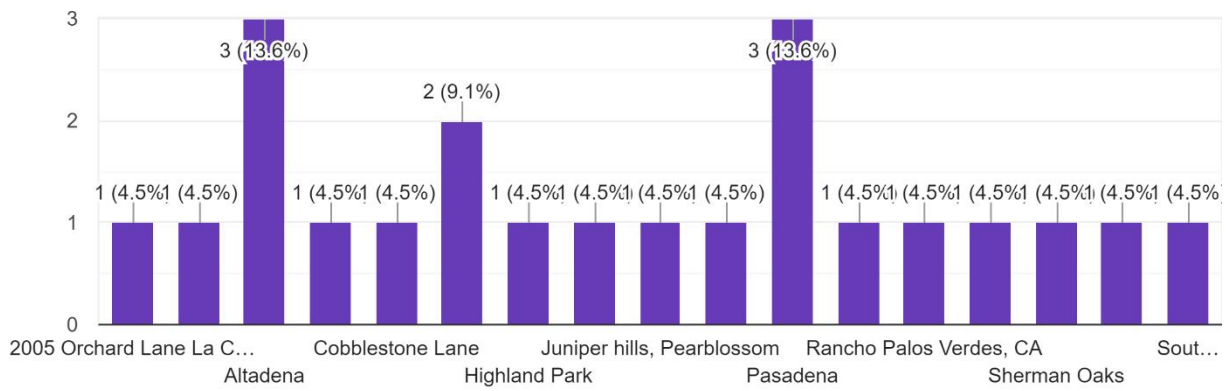
Do you live in La Cañada Flintridge?

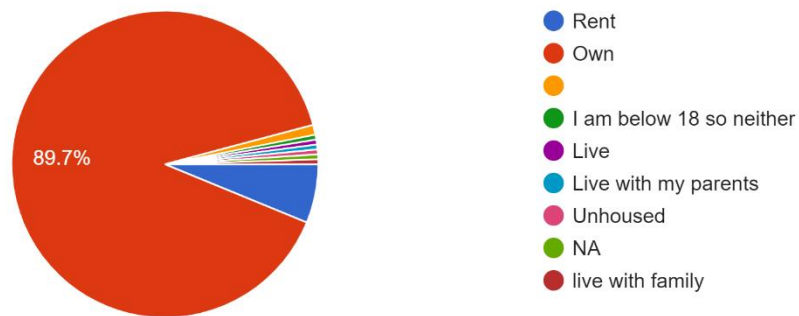
If no, where do you live?

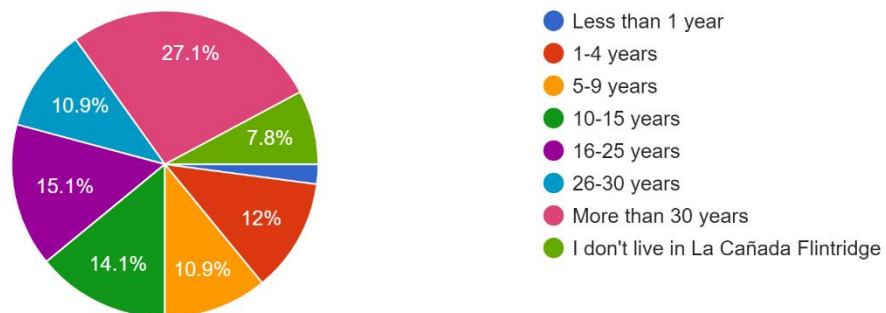
Do you rent or own?

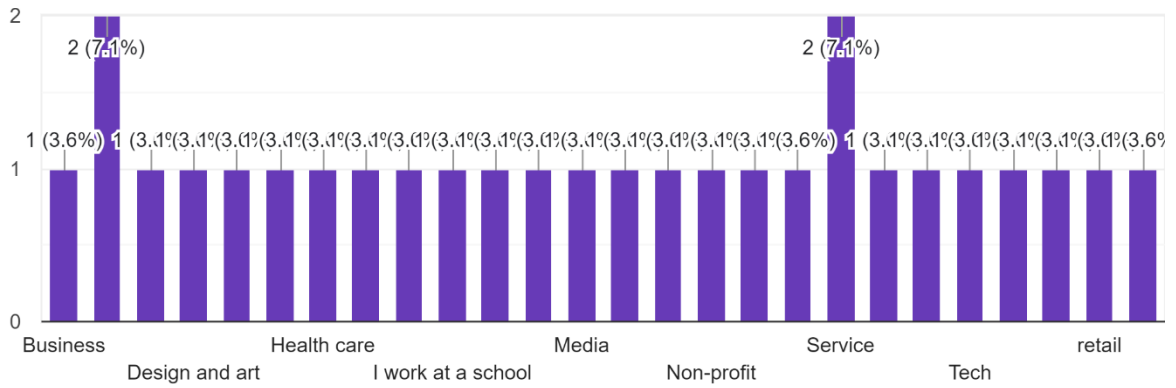
How long have you lived in La Cañada Flintridge?

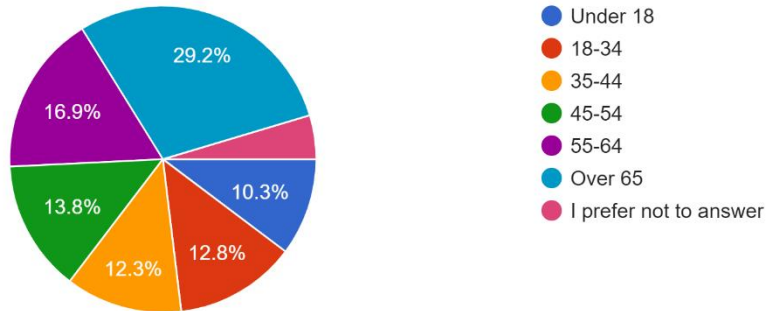
If you own a business in La Cañada Flintridge, what kind of business?

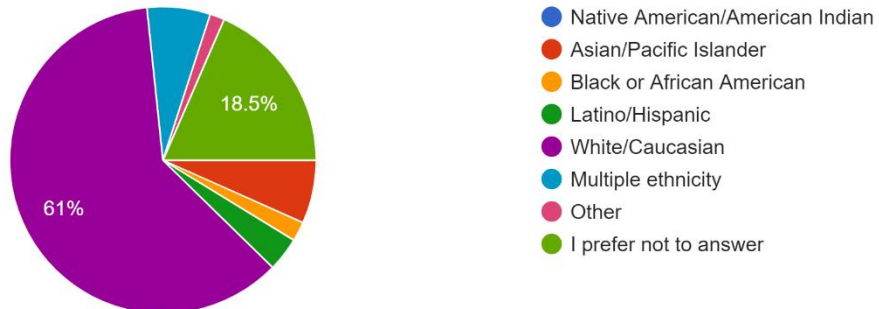
What is your age?

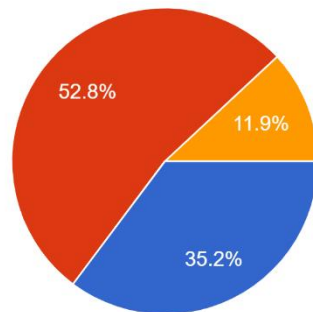
Which race or ethnicity best describes you? (Please choose only one)

What gender do you identify as?

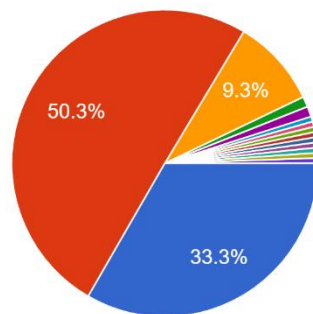
