As e-bikes become more and more popular, it is essential to prioritize safety on our streets, especially for minors.





Recently, there has been an uptick in the number of minors on e-bikes on City streets.

We want to remind parents and all residents of the importance of responsible riding.

Together, we can protect our community and keep our streets safe for everyone.



Remember to wear a helmet. While the law requires a helmet for anyone under 18 years of age, all riders are required to wear a helmet on a class 3 E-Bike (Section 21213 CVC).

Dismount and walk your e-bike on the sidewalk and crosswalk, and remember to yield to pedestrians.

Riding in the opposite direction of traffic is prohibited, and you must stop at red lights.

It is illegal to carry passengers on your e-bike unless your bike has an extra permanent seat or uses a child safety seat.

In the event of a crash that involves injuries or property damage, motorists and bicyclists are required to stay at the scene and exchange information or wait until law enforcement arrives.

A bicyclist can be guilty of Reckless Driving, which is a Misdemeanor. Reckless Driving includes doing a wheelie and driving in between traffic (lane splitting) during high traffic times, like drop-off and pick up before and after school.
